All events will be seeded and swum on entry time and sorted into age groups after the

completion of the event.

Ages: As at 7th Sept 2024.

Age Groups: 11ys, 12yrs, 13yrs, 14yrs, 15yrs, 16yrs+.

Entry Fees: £5 for 50m events; £6 for 100m events; £7 for 200m IM.

Closing date for entries: 12 noon Saturday 10th August 2024.

Sessions: S1: 09:00hrs for 10:00hrs start; S2: 13:30hrs for 14:30hrs start.

Warm-ups: 09:00 – 09:55hrs (4x 13mins) &13:30 – 14:25hrs (4x 13mins)

NOTE: Warm-up and start times maybe subject to change

Awards: All events are Heat Declared Winners (no Finals). Medals for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finishes by age group.

Officials: Clubs entering this meet are asked to provide a minimum of two STO's in order that we can apply for accreditation, ideally at least 1 Judge and 1 Timekeeper. Please provide this information to our Gala Convenor, Sheena Cheung at sheenacheung@hotmail.co.uk after the draft programme has been issued.

Lunch: Morning coffee and lunch will be provided for STO's attending both sessions and coaches that have purchased a lunch.

General Meet Information

- The current FINA and SASA rules of competitive swimming will apply.
- Meet to be held under S.A.S.A. rules. Accreditation sought under Licence No. L2/ED/057/SEP24.
- Age as at 7th of September 2024
- All swimmers must have a current SASA or equivalent registration number.
- All events will be Heat Declared Winners.
- Over the top starts will be used at the discretion of the meet organisers.
- Electronic timing will be in operation. In the event of electronic timing failure then back-up manual timing will be used.
- The organisers reserve the right to restrict entries to allow for the smooth running of the meet. Rejected entries will be refunded in full. Withdrawals on the day must be made to the recorders no later than 45 minutes prior to the start of each session. There are no refunds for entries withdrawn after the draft programme is prepared.
- Swimmers must act on the instructions given by the meet officials and behave in a reasonable manner at all times.
- It is the responsibility of each club to ensure that their swimmers are aware of the meet rules and guidelines.
- The meet will adhere to Scottish Swimming 'Swimwear Policies'. The policies are included in full in the appendices of Scottish Swimming Regulations.
- Start sheets will be available to clubs prior to the start of each session.
- It is the swimmer's responsibility to check in with the marshals in the allocated area. Swimmers should report to the marshals' five heats in advance of their race.
- Medals for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finishes in each event and age group (11yrs, 12yrs, 13yrs, 14yrs, 15yrs, 16yrs+). Medals will be available for collection at the end of each session and during the session when results are known and published.
- Result sheets will be posted on the poolside walls outside the changing rooms and on the spectator balcony as early as possible after each event. Results will be emailed to participating clubs and also posted at http://www.swimscotland.co.uk
- To avoid the unnecessary waste where empty lanes appear, reserves will be drawn from the reserve list and Dunedin Swim Team swimmers.
- The Meet Management reserves the right to alter the programme and warm-up times if necessary.
- Anything not covered above and not printed in the event programme will be at the promoters' discretion.

Warm-Ups

- Warm-ups may only commence when advised to do so.
- No diving other than in sprint lanes.
- Swimmers must keep moving during warm-up to avoid congestion in the pool.
- The meet stewards will determine the sprint lanes and direction of swims.
- No congregating allowed at either end of the lanes.

Miscellaneous

- The organisers reserve the right to exclude or refuse admission to any competitor, spectator or team official.
- Neither Dunedin Swim Team nor the Xcite Leisure Centre can be held responsible for loss or damage to any property. Swimmers should use the lockers provided and not leave belongings lying around unattended. Bags should not be taken onto poolside they should remain in lockers.
- No glassware may be taken into the showers or poolside. Anyone doing so will be liable to expulsion from the meet.
- Outdoor footwear must not be worn on the poolside area.
- Swimmers MUST wear dry clothing and footwear at all times when not in poolside area.
- The Dunedin Swim Team committee retains the right to amend any of the above conditions as necessary.
- No guarantee can be given by Dunedin Swim Team that the event will take place at a particular time, place, or date and they reserve the right to reschedule the event without notice and without liability for doing so. It is expected that this would only be as a result of unforeseen circumstances, e.g., venue/facility failure or adverse weather.
- In the event of postponement, cancellation or abandonment of the event, refunds if any, will be made at the absolute discretion of Dunedin Swim Team. Dunedin Swim Team will have no liability to make a refund or to pay any form of consequential or indirect damage such as loss of enjoyment, travel and accommodation costs.
- Anything not covered in the above or in the event programme will be at the organisers' discretion.

Transgender Competition Policy

As of the 1st January 2024 the Scottish Swimming Transgender & Non-Binary Competition Policy was implemented nationally across all aquatics sports. The policy and FAQs can be found here. Any policy related matters that arise during the event should be reported to and will be recorded by the Meet Manager and these matters will be communicated to and managed post event by the relevant Scottish Swimming Staff. At no point will members be challenged on the day of a competition with any matters being resolved post event. As a result of this policy being implemented, by entering the Female category, athletes are therefore confirming their birth sex is female and are eligible to compete in the Female category.

Safeguarding

The primary safeguarding point of contact for the event in relation to wellbeing & protection matters or accidents is the Meet Organiser. The secondary point of contact is the Scottish Swimming Safeguarding Manager.

Controlling the Use of Photographic Equipment

By attending the event either as a participant, volunteer, team staff or spectator, you accept that any photographs / videos taken will not be used for illicit purposes or that pictures / films produced will not be altered in any way or uploaded onto the web without the consent in writing of the person(s) photographed / filmed.

The use of mobile phones or other electronic devices capable of photography are not permitted to be used at any time in the changing village, toilets or shower areas.

Spectators who wish to take images are requested to focus on their own family member as much as reasonably possible and to avoid including other participants in images, particularly if those images are being shared with family and friends or through social media platforms.

The use of professional camera equipment and flash photography is prohibited at the Event. Only accredited media can use this type of equipment. Media wishing to gain accreditation must put the request in writing to the event organiser prior to the start of the competition.
